Reflection for the Presentation of Christ

Today is the feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. Our Gospel reading tells the story of that visit. The opening and closing paragraphs are like brackets, outlining the legal requirements that have to take place and telling us that they have been fulfilled. As a first born son, Jesus must be presented and a sacrifice must be made, in this case a pair of turtle doves. Mary must also be purified after child birth under the terms of the Jewish law so that she can once again play a full part in the worshipping community. The closing paragraph tells us that all these requirements have been fulfilled and they can then return to Nazareth.

In between the brackets, Mary and Joseph meet two elderly people who were faithfully waiting for something enlightening to happen. They are just not sure what that be, but they recognise and appearance of Mary and Joseph as a sign. Simeon takes Jesus in his arms and says the words which we know as the Nunc Dimittus, the second canticle sung at Choral Evensong. The words that Simeon speaks intertwine themes of hope peace and expectation, amazing words for the baby's parents to hear. Simeon then suggests the there will be a mixed reaction as to how the adult Jesus is received and that his parents will also endure hardship,

Mary and Joseph also encounter Anna, a woman who has lived in the temple for many years since being widowed, praying and fasting on a daily basis. She speaks of the baby Jesus as being responsible for the redemption of Jerusalem, something that must have seemed more than slightly surprising for the parents to take in given their little bundle's tender age.

Each of these elderly people have live lives if faith, looking forward to what amazing things God will do for them as individuals and as a wider nation in their spiritual journeys. I am not sure that either of them expected their hopes to be fulfilled in the future life and ministry of the infant that was presented in the temple on that day. But, nevertheless, they welcomed and embraced Jesus and his parents as they carried out the reasons for their temple visit.

Despite most of us not being in our first flush of youth, like Anna and Simeon, we will encounter God in a variety of ways which may catch us off our guard. Our response should be open and hopeful, full of expectation for what God will do, through the workings of the Holy Spirit, in welcoming and embracing us, as well as a wide variety of others, into God's family of love and joy.

Lord Jesus Christ, light of the nations and glory of Israel: make your home among us, and present us pure and holy to your heavenly Father, your God, and our God. Amen. **LENT LUNCHES:** The beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, heralds the start of this year's Lent Lunches!



There's a busy month of music-making at St Peter's Church Dorchester during February.


