

Reflection for the 2nd before Lent

Who then is this, that he commands even the wind and the water, and they obey him.

All these readings tell us how God the Trinty, created our universe, how powerful God is, was and is to come. And yet creation is in in a mess because of human behaviour. And in the west, Christianity's creation myths are often seen as the foundation of the behaviour that is causing the destruction of our planet. These readings do not include the all-important passage, where God gave humans dominion over the earth, but is does include God asking man/human to name the creatures. In many traditions if you name something you have a form of control over them.

Elsewhere in Genesis we read that God made humans in the image of God, in other words full of justice, love, peace which honours the poor over the rich, all of creation is equal. This is the upside-down world of Christ. Jesus is in a boat with his disciples who are fishermen, who are frightened even though their knowledge of the sea of Galilee is profound and generational, they fear for their lives. Life has once again been tipped upside down, and Jesus, who is now beginning to experience himself as possibly being the Messiah, calms the wind and the sea. I wonder if he is surprised as the disciples were that he was successful. He does not show it, we experience him as full of authority He is in charge.

Jesus was 100% human and 100% divine. We are made in the image of God. Within us all we have the ability to turn this destructive trajectory of the planet upside down. Like the fishermen, as a race we are learning to how to live within the planet, we are getting to know the planet and to learn from it. We are honouring and learning from those indigenous people who have been living alongside creation, without destroying it. We are using our ever growing Godgiven expansive knowledge and creativity to find new ways to live our everyday lives differently. We are finding new ways to capture carbon, we are finding ways to produce less carbon, we are increasing diversity by becoming aware of how we garden, and how we spend our money with the planet always in mind. We cannot slack, we have to carry on, we are still in danger. We need to continue to change. God has given us the capability to redirect this situation, becoming resigned to failure is not an option. It was not the option the disciples took, when they were in danger. They woke Jesus up. We must wake up Christ within us and call upon him, the Holy Spirit and God, our creator to give us hope and continue our journey into new and unfamiliar ways of living.

LENT LUNCHES: The beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, heralds the start of this year's Lent Lunches!

Come along on **Fridays 14, 21 and 28 March and 11 April**, to enjoy a Lent lunch consisting of homemade soup and bread followed by a cup of tea or coffee.
